PRODUCT INFO	M138410 - 25 x non-scented Anemone de Caen (7/8cm corms) with red, white, pink and blue flowers
THIS SELECTION CONTAINS	25 x Mixed Anemone
ON ARRIVAL	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Open packaging immediately upon arrival to allow air to circulate around the corms.</li> <li>• Ideally, plant your corms as soon as possible.</li> <li>• Avoid planting if the ground is frozen or waterlogged.</li> <li>• If planting is delayed, store the root in a dark, cool and frost-free place until you are ready.</li> <li>• Prior to planting, rehydrate dried corms by soaking in a saucer of water for 2-3 hours.</li> </ul>
WHERE TO PLANT	<p><b>PLANTING IN-GROUND (BED OR BORDER)</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Dig small holes with a narrow trowel.</li> <li>• Plant corms 2" deep, ensuring corms are placed on their longest side, rather than laid flat.</li> <li>• Fill the hole with soil and firm in gently.</li> <li>• Water well with a watering can fitted with a sprinkler.</li> <li>• Space individual corms 3" apart.</li> </ul> <p><b>PLANTING IN CONTAINERS OR BASKETS</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Pot corms directly into containers filled with good quality compost. One is perfect in a 6" wide pot.</li> <li>• Fill the pot with compost, leaving a 2" gap at the top.</li> <li>• Make a 2" deep hole in the centre and pot in a corm.</li> <li>• Cover with compost, firm into place and water well.</li> </ul>
WATERING	These plants will grow best if watered regularly during the growing season, especially during hot, dry spells.
PRUNING / TRIMMING	Remove fading flowers to keep plants tidy.
FEEDING	No feeding required.
WINTER CARE INSTRUCTIONS	Once the leaves start to turn yellow, cut to the ground. If your soil is free draining, corms can be left in place to naturalise. Those with soil that retains moisture should lift corms from the ground, allow to dry and store them in a frost-free place until next spring. Move pots into a sheltered place, such as a greenhouse or front porch.
CONTAINER SIZE + RECOMMENDED NUMBER OF PLANTS PER CONTAINER	One plant per 6" wide pot.
